

Instruction for Authors

Nukleonika accepts manuscripts (original, review and invited papers, technical notes, letters to the editors) from the fields of nuclear sciences especially of nuclear chemistry, radiation chemistry, radiation physics, chemistry of isotopes, radiobiology, and nuclear techniques in industry and environmental protection.

MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

Send two (2) copies of the manuscript and two (2) full sets of illustrations, with a cover letter, including the complete name, address, telephone and facsimile numbers, and e-mail address of the communicating author, and a statement that all authors have approved the manuscript, addressed to:

MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION

Manuscript must be typed double spaced with broad margins (2.5 cm). The pages should be numbered consecutively. The manuscript should be presented in the order indicated.

TITLE PAGE

The first page should contain the manuscript's title, the complete name of all authors (first name, middle initials, surname), the departmental and institutional affiliations and complete street or mailing addresses of all authors, the telephone and fax numbers and e-mail address for the corresponding author, and the city, state and country where the work was performed. At the bottom of the title page, any acknowledgments of grant support should be indicated.

ABSTRACT AND KEY WORDS

An abstract of not than 250 words and up to six (6) key words in alphabetical order for coding and indexing are essential. It should be a factual, not descriptive, statement of study objectives, methods, principal results, and conclusions.

TEXT

The text should be organized into an introductory section, including the background and purpose of the study, and then into sections. In certain circumstances the nature of the report does not lend to this format. Underline any words or phrases to be emphasized by italics.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

Individuals who where of direct help in the reported work should be acknowledged by a brief statement on a separate page immediately following the text.

REFERENCES

References must be listed in consecutive alphabetical order and numbered. All references must be cited in the text or tables. Unpublished data and personal communications are not acceptable references. Papers that have been accepted but not yet published are acceptable, as long as a pre-print accompanies the manuscript. All references must be verified against the original documents. Abbreviations of journals must conform to those in the list of Journals indexed in Index Chemicus.

Journals

References to journal articles should include surnames and initials of author(s) (list all authors if fewer than seven; if seven or more, list only the first three, followed by *et al.*), year, full title of article, abbreviated journal name, volume, and inclusive pagination:

Books

References to a book should include surnames and initials of author(s), year, title of book, city, publisher and edition:

Chapter in a book

References to a chapter in a book should include surname and initials of author(s), year, chapter title, editor(s), book title, publisher, city, volume (if applicable), section (if applicable), and inclusive pagination:

Asmus K-D (1989) Sulfur-centered three-electron bonded species. In: Chatgililoglu C, Asmus K-D (eds) Sulfur-centered reactive intermediates in chemistry and biology, 2nd ed. Plenum Press, New York, pp 155-172

Papers in conference proceedings or abstracts

This references should include surnames and initials of author(s), year, title, title of conference, city, publisher, and inclusive pagination:

TABLES

Each table should be typed double spaced on a separate sheet of paper, numbered consecutively with Arabic numbers, and contain a brief title at the top. All tables must be cited in the text.

FIGURES

Legends for figures should be typed double spaced on a separate sheet and numbered consecutively with Arabic numbers corresponding to the figures. All figures must be cited in the text. Figures should be professionally drawn using Corel 11 (*.cdr or *.tif) program, and submitted as black and white, high quality glossy prints. Special attention should be paid to focus and contrast. Symbols, letters, arrows, and numbers must be of sufficient size and contrast to be clearly recognizable when the figure is reduced to publication size. The optimal width for the figure is 8 cm. We encourage the submission of supplemental illustrations. Artwork to accepted manuscripts will not be returned unless a written request accompanies the page proofs. A limited number of illustrations in full collar will be considered, but author may be required to bear the cost of their reproduction.

ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF FINAL ACCEPTED MANUSCRIPTS

Please send an electronic version of your manuscript with the final, accepted, double spaced hard copy. It is the author's responsibility to ensure that the disk and hard copy match.

TEXT should prepared on a PC in any version of Word. Do not use desktop publishing software. Keep the document as simple as possible and avoid complex formatting. Follow the instructions for references very carefully. If incorrectly styled, the value of the diskette submission will be reduced.

FIGURES should be prepared in Corel 11 (*.cdr or *.tif) program and written as separated files.

ABBREVIATIONS, SPELLING AND UNITS

All nomenclature should be consistent, clear, unambiguous and accordance with the rules constituted in a given branch. Authors should, whenever possible, conform to the nomenclature, symbols and abbreviations established for chemistry and physics by IUPAC and IUPAP and used in the Chemical Abstracts.

PERMISSIONS

Copyrighted materials from other sources must be accompanied by written permission from both the publisher and author for reproduction. Any personal communication used in the text must be accompanied by a letter agreeing to be quoted as written.

REVIEW AND ACTION

Manuscripts will be examined by the editorial staff and sent to two reviewers. Authors will be notified of the disposition of their manuscript within 60 days.

PUBLICATION FEES

Page charge of \$60 per page may be paid for articles published in this journal. Payment does not affect acceptance or scheduling of papers. Accepted manuscripts will not be forwarded to production until the publication charges are paid in full.
